



Adam Karl Llewellyn

April 25, 1944 - July 30, 2024

CDR Adam Karl Llewellyn, USN (Ret.), 80, of Mt. Jackson, VA, passed away Tuesday, July 30th, 2024, at his home. Interment will take place at the United States Naval Academy in Annapolis, MD, following a service at St. Andrews Chapel, on Monday, September 23rd, 2024.

Adam was born April 25th, 1944, in San Mateo, California, son of the late Adam George and Pearl Davison Watmough. He was preceded in death by his brother, Timothy Llewellyn.

Adam graduated from Napa High School, Napa, CA in 1962. Following a year at the University of California, Davis, he reported to the United States Naval Academy, from which he graduated in 1967. He served on the USS Richard B. Anderson (DD-786) and USS El Paso (LKA-117), and entered the Navy Reserve in 1971. Following graduation from the University of Miami School of Law in 1974, he returned to active duty, serving in the Judge Advocate General's Corps until his retirement from the Navy in 1991.

Adam's career continued at the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs in Washington, DC, where he was an Appellate Litigation Attorney, until his retirement from civil service in 2006.

In retirement, Adam split his time between his home in Virginia, and a second home in Thomaston, Maine. His hobbies included sports, music, genealogy,

and travel.

Adam is survived by his wife, Pamela Herbener Llewellyn, whom he married on June 8th, 1967; sons Karl Llewellyn and wife, Melissa of Crofton, MD; Craig Llewellyn and wife Pam of Bel Air, MD; sisters, Polly Frenkel (Emmanuel), Beth McLaughlin, Janet Llewellyn, and four grandchildren, Kate, Gavin, Emelia and Samuel.
