Daniel Lee "Danny" Strother, 73, of Maurertown, VA, passed away peacefully on April 29, 2026, surrounded by the love of his family, after complications from a stroke.

Danny had a way of making people feel seen, valued, and cared for, and his love and kindness touched more lives than he ever realized.

We will miss his “Dad jokes” you know the ones he laughed at even if no one else did, along with the steady stream of silly memes and texts that brightened our days. Those small, familiar moments will be missed more than words can express.

Above all else, Danny’s greatest love was his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. He never hesitated to share his testimony, often speaking openly about his past so he could remind others that “even someone like him” could be loved and saved. Of all the things he would want us to remember, is that the message of grace and redemption mattered most to him.

Danny leaves behind his stepchildren, Bucky Runion, Connie Runion, and Beth Runion, along with their families. He is also survived by those he loved as his own: Wade Jenkins and his wife, Nicole; their children, Chance Jenkins, RJ Daley, Shelby Baker, and Zach Baker and his wife, Kim; as well as Sheron Painter and her husband, Ryan, and their children, Hunter, Brylee, and Amelia Painter and his niece, Shannon “Sissy” Henry.

Danny was preceded in death by his beloved “brother,” Charles David Jenkins, who we know was there to welcome him home in Heaven.
