Dorothy Craig "Dot" Lowerre, 81, of Strasburg and formerly of Woodstock, passed away Sunday, February 17, 2019, at Greenfield of Strasburg. A memorial service will be held Monday, February 25, 2019, at 1:00 p.m. at Woodstock Presbyterian Church. Reverend Kate Rascoe will officiate.

Mrs. Lowerre was born November 8, 1937, in Pittsburgh, PA., daughter of the late Charles Edward and Mary Nelson Craig. She was a 1959 graduate of Penn State University.
