Floyd Alvin "Al" Miller, 77, of Woodstock, passed away Sunday, June 29, 2014 at Shenandoah Memorial Hospital in Woodstock. The funeral will be held Thursday, July 3, at 11:00 a.m. at Dellinger Funeral Home in Woodstock with burial following at Sunset View Memorial Gardens in Woodstock.
