Frances Marie Good Rohrbaugh, 93, of Maurertown, VA, passed away peacefully Saturday, September 17, 2016 at her home on Back Road. Her family will host a Memorial Service on Thursday, September 22, 2016 at 3 p.m. at Dellinger Funeral Home in Woodstock, VA. Born October 30, 1922 in Washington D.C., Fran was a daughter of the late Franklin E. Good and Florence Fleming Good, also formerly of Maurertown. She graduated from the Washington School for Secretaries, met her husband, the late Joseph W. (Woody) Rohrbaugh at Ft. Belvoir during World War II, and spent much of her adult life in Bucks County, PA while working as an administrative secretary for the president of the Educational Testing Service in Princeton, NJ. In 1976 Fran and Woody retired to her ancestral home in Maurertown, where they ran a bed and breakfast in the 1980s and happily spent the remainder of their lives. Fran was an accomplished potter and did volunteer work with the Woodstock Museum, Woodstock Library and Shenandoah Memorial Hospital well into this century. The life of any party, she was a lively, caring neighbor, an avid bridge player, and a purveyor of irreverent jokes until the end. Fran's husband, Woody (in 2010) and a younger sister, Betty Jean Good Thomas (in 1981), preceded her in death. Survivors include two sons and daughters-in-law, Michael Joseph Rohrbaugh and Lucy Godfrey Banks of Maurertown and Falls Church, VA, and John Franklin Rohrbaugh and Virginia Ann Rohrbaugh of Shady Side, MD; and four grandchildren, Marie Ann Carbone, William Berlyn Rohrbaugh, Michael Craig Kaplan and Melanie Elisabeth McCarville.
