SFC George Robert "'Sarge'" Carter, USA RET, 82, passed away peacefully on Tuesday, September 20, 2011 after losing a long battle with Cancer at Winchester Medical Center . Born in Woodstock, Va. on August 15, 1929, the son of the late George Robert Carter, Sr. and the late Anna McKelvey Carter. A Prayer Service with Rosary will be held on Friday, September 30, 2011 at 6:30 p.m. at Dellinger's Funeral Home, followed by Family Visitation from 7:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. A funeral mass will be conducted on Saturday, October 1, 2011 at 1:00 p.m. at St. John Bosco Catholic Church followed by full Military Honors. He retired from the U.S. Army after 21 years and 6 months of service. While serving his country he fought in the Korean War with multiple tours in Korea, Japan, Germany, and throughout the U.S. After his service with the military his career included Massanutten Military Academy and Christendom College in Front Royal as a Food Service Director and at the Driving Range in Bryce Resort. He was a member of the St. John Bosco Catholic Church, a lifetime member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 2447, a lifetime member of the American Legion Post 199, and a charter member of the Woodstock Moose Lodge 575. He is preceded in death by his brothers Thomas Randall Carter and Edward Lee Carter.
