Jack Allen Proctor, Sr. 78 of Richmond, formerly of Mt. Jackson, passed away peacefully on March 10, 2011 at his home. Jack was born January 10, 1933 in Mt. Jackson at the Moonlight Cottage, the son of the late Verlin R. Proctor, Jr. and Anna Mae Proctor Funkhouser. He served 22 years in the United States Navy as an electrical engineer and career counselor, serving the last 2 years at the Pentagon. He was Shenandoah County's first building code official and was appointed the first statewide building Code Supervisor and rose to be the Deputy Director of the State Building Code Enforcement Division. He also served as the State Fire Marshall. He was a national leader in the effort to adopt a standard, uniform building code and trained, advised and inspired building code professionals from throughout the nation. The State Training Academy for building code officials was named in his honor upon his retirement, after 30 years of service to the State of Virginia. He is survived by his wife, Suk Proctor, sons, William Proctor, Jack A. Proctor, Jr.; daughters, Jill Irby, Rose Aquaro, Emma Gaccione, Susannah Proctor, Dorothy Keffer, Marie Snyder, Heather Bowers; brothers, Gary Proctor, Verlin (Rusty) Proctor III,; sisters, Gloria Poe, Kay Miller; 19 grandchildren, and 5 great grandchildren. He was preceded in death by a son, Allen Proctor. The family will receive friends tonight from 7 to 8:30 pm at the Dellinger Funeral Home. Mt. Jackson, where services will be held Sunday, March 13, 2:30 pm by Rev. Steve Proctor. Burial will follow at the Mt. Jackson Cemetery.
