James Pratt Lincoln II, 65 of Harrisonburg passed away Tuesday, April 7, 2015 in Woodstock. A Memorial Service will be held on Friday, April 17th at 1 pm at the Cathedral Shrine of the Transfiguration, Shrine Mont, Orkney Springs, Virginia. The Right Reverend Edwin F. "Ted" Gulick Jr. will officiate. Mr. Lincoln was born November 21, 1949 in Williamsburg, Virginia. He was the son of the late Reverend James Lincoln, Sr. and Anne Cleveland Lincoln.
