Janet Boyer Stultz, 90, of Woodstock, Va., passed away on Sunday, November 2, 2025. She was born on October 19, 1935, in Waterlick, Va., to Ernest Lee Boyer and Nancy Jane (Campbell) Boyer. Janet was a member of Woodstock United Methodist Church, Dorcas Circle, and TOP of VA Quilt Guild. She will be remembered for her quilting, sewing, and gardening skills, and for her
