Joseph Dominic Dannucci, 95, of Woodstock, passed away Tuesday, August 20, 2019, at his home. A memorial service will be held at a later date.

Mr. Dannucci was born October 23, 1923, in Bound Brook, New Jersey, son of the late Ralph and Rose Bambo Dannucci. He was an Army veteran of World War II serving as a radio operator for the 3rd infantry division. He served 22 months in the European Theatre and participated in four major campaigns. He received the Purple Heart and Oak Leaf Cluster for wounds received in Italy and Germany. He received his Bachelor's Degree and Masters Degree from the Juilliard School of Music. He formerly worked as a string music teacher at Chatham High School in Chatham, NJ., and as an interpreter for Colonial Williamsburg. He was a member of Wesley Chapel United Methodist Church and performed locally as a violinist. He was preceded in death by two sons, Gregory Paul Dannucci and Robert James Dannucci.

He is survived by his wife of 67 years, Joan Campbell Dannucci whom he married on August 17, 1952; daughter, Pamela Dannucci Imbimbo and husband Donald of NJ; son, Keith Joseph Dannucci of NJ; two grandchildren, Sarah Imbimbo and Daniel Imbimbo and wife Laurie Brooks; and two great-grandchildren, Ella and Chloe Imbimbo.
