Kaye Virginia Keyser Norris, 74, of Woodstock, passed away Tuesday, May 30, 2017 at her home. A memorial service will be held Saturday, June 3 at 11:00 a.m. at St. John's United Methodist Church in Edinburg. Reverend Robert Jones will officiate. Burial will be private at Cedarwood Cemetery in Edinburg. The family will receive friends at 123 S. Church St. Woodstock from 4-7 pm on Thursday June 1.

Mrs. Norris was born March 27, 1943 in Front Royal, daughter of the late Joseph William and Clara Sedwick Keyser. She was a public school teacher for 39 years, having taught at Woodstock Middle School, Central High School and retired from Broadway High School. She was a member of the Edinburg United Methodist Parish, United Methodist Church Women, Alpha Delta Kappa, Shenandoah County Retired Teachers Association and was on the Board of Charter House. She was preceded in death by her husband, Reverend Richard Eaton Norris.
