Leonard Earl Campbell, 80, of New Market, died Wednesday, September 16, 2015 at his home. Mr. Campbell was born July 10, 1935 in Page County, son of the late Rufus Gideon and Margie Irene Calhoun Campbell. He served in the United States Army in the 11th Airborne in Germany during the Korean War. Mr. Campbell retired from the Falls Church Police Department and was owner and operator of Lenny Campbell Service Company. He was a dedicated leader in the Brethren faith, including building and development in local churches and serving as deacon and trustee. He was preceded in death by his wife, Clota Buchanan Campbell, July 12, 2015. They were married August 1, 1953. He is survived by two daughters, Clota Ann Hinkle and husband, Larry, of New Market and Sandy Cyphert and husband, Charles, of Shenandoah; two sons, Leonard Lee Campbell and wife, Kathy, of Louisa and James Wayne Campbell and wife, Cindy of Woodstock; three sisters, Doris Cave and Virginia Itterly, both of Luray, and Mildred Simmers of Montpelier; eight grand- children; and 12 great grandchildren.
