Louise Kathleen Fox Gochenour, 96, of Woodstock, passed from this life to her heavenly home on Sunday, December 6, 2015 at Life Care Center in New Market, Virginia. Louise was born on December 20, 1918 in Warren County, Virginia, and was the daughter of Calvin M. Fox and Anna Elizabeth Alexander Fox who preceded her in death. Louise was also preceded in death by her beloved husband Lee C. Gochenour on August 14, 2014 after 67 years of marriage. Louise started her career in finance at the American Viscose in Front Royal, Virginia in 1943 until 1961 for 18 years of service. She later moved to Richmond, Virginia where she started her career in banking with Bank of Virginia, and retired from there in 1989. Louise was a member of Epiphany Evangelical Lutheran Church in Richmond, Virginia and then when moving back she attended Mt. Zion Lutheran Church before joining Emanuel Lutheran Church in Woodstock. She was a member of the Eastern Star in Richmond and Woodstock, Virginia. Louise is survived by one sister, Betty Fox Lunceford of Marshall, Virginia. She is also survived by many nieces, nephews, and long-time family friends. Louise's service will be held on Thursday, December 10, 2015 at 10:30 a.m. at Emanuel Lutheran Church in Woodstock. Pastor Nathan Robinson will officiate. Burial will follow in Sunset
