Mildred H. Truban of Winchester, Virginia, known as AMillie, born September 8, 1925, in New Kensington, Pennsylvania, died on July 24, 2014. She is survived by her six children - John W. She has suffered from Alzheimer's in the later years of her life and resided at Westminster Canterbury, Winchester, Virginia. She graduated from West Penn Hospital School of Nursing, Pittsburg, Pennsylvania, and attended West Virginia Wesleyan College and was a registered nurse. She and her husband, Bill Truban, were married on May 28, 1949, and settled in Woodstock, Virginia in 1953, where they maintained Shenandoah Animal Hospital for more than 50 years. In addition to raising her

family, she was an avid tennis player and garden club member, but considered her work for the church to be of paramount importance.
