Norman Edward Turner, 90 of Edinburg, died Monday, July 7, 2014 at Shenandoah Memorial Hospital in Woodstock. Mr. Turner was born May 23, 1924 in Hudson Cross Roads, son of the late Charles F. and Annie Coffman Turner. Mr. Turner served in the Civilian Conservation Corp at Camp Roosevelt, Edinburg, Virginia.
