Price McDonald, 85, of Woodstock, died Sunday, January 2, 2011. He was born March 28, 1925 in Tuttle, Oklahoma, son of Tyler and Edna McDonald. He was preceded in death by his wife, Margaret Ann Sherrod McDonald and his sister Glenola McDonald Wall of Mid-West City, Oklahoma. He is survived by his brother, CJ McDonald of Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and by his children, Sherrie McDonald Brady and husband Francis Joseph Brady of Fairfax, Virginia, Linda McDonald O'Rear and husband Milton J. O'Rear Jr. of Woodstock, Virginia, Mark McDonald of Harahan, Louisiana, David McDonald of Santa Rosa Beach, Florida, 9 grandchildren, and 1 great grandchild. He was a WWII B-17 navigator in the 15th Air Force, 2nd Bomb Group in Foggia, Italy. He received a BS degree in Mechanical Engineering from Oklahoma University in 1947. His professional career began with Halliburton in Wyoming then he worked for Humble Oil/Esso Oil in Texas, Louisiana and Mississippi; while working for the U.S. Geological Survey, Department of the Interior, he resided in New Orleans, Louisiana and Vienna, Virginia. Upon retirement in 1987 Price and Margaret moved to Woodstock, Virginia and owned and operated The Azalea House Bed & Breakfast on Main Street for 10 years. Price served as docent with the Woodstock Museum and was an active member of the Woodstock Presbyterian Church as elder, assistant treasurer and Sunday school teacher. The family will receive friends at Dellinger Funeral Home in Woodstock on Thursday, January 6, 2011, at 7:00 p.m. The graveside service will be private. The memorial service will be held at
