Quinten Elsworth Thorpe, 68, of Woodstock, passed away quietly at Shenandoah County Memorial Hospital, surrounded by family on Tuesday, August 26, 2014, after a brief battle with cancer. He was the eldest son of the late Martha Lou Ritenour Thompson. Born March 8, 1946, Quinten spent his entire life in the Woodstock area. Survivors include his two children, Shannon Thorpe Campbell and her husband Jeff of Strasburg, and Brandon A.
