Richard Fredrick Hottle, 83, of Woodstock, VA passed away peacefully at home on October 19, 2020. The funeral service will be held Saturday, October 24, at 11:00 a.m. at Valley Funeral Service, Edinburg, VA. Pastors Mark Bowyer, P.G. Coverstone, and Chad Estep will officiate. Mask are required. While stationed in England, he received his high school diploma and furthered his college education through the University of Maryland.

He was preceded in death by his first wife of 27 years, Nancy Sherman Hottle; brothers, Weldon E. Hottle, Edward Hottle, Gary N. Hottle, and sister, Anna

Hottle Markley. Richard is survived by his wife of 31 years, E.
